CLUB SERVICES: Promotes strong club administration, long-term follow-up for new clubs and assists Optimist clubs needing administrative assistance.

ESSAY CONTEST: Promotes Club Essay contest and conducts District Essay Contest.

FINANCE: Prepares proposed annual District Budget, ensures adherence to fiscal policies and exercises supervisory care of district financial transactions.

INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION AMBASSADOR: Promotes attendance and involvement at the Optimist International Convention.

LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT: Training of Club, Zone and District Leaders in areas of growth, administration, and motivation at Zone, District and Convention meetings.

MEMBERSHIP and RETENTION: Responsible for implementing a club membership retention program, developing and executing a vigorous new member campaign, and gives administrative assistance to Clubs as they work to achieve their membership goals.

NEW CLUB BUILDING: Responsible for implementing the International New Club Building program. Directly assists the Lt. Governors and clubs in meeting their New Club Building goals.

OPTIMIST INTERNATIONAL FOUNDATION: Promotes the Foundation by updating members on its purpose and achievements. It also seeks donations, collects all funds and gives receipts upon request.

OIJGC: Promotes and supervises Club and District Junior Golf Championship Golf Tournaments.

ORATORICAL: Promotes and supervises the Club, Zone, Regional and District Oratorical Contests.

POSTER CONTEST: Annual theme to be announced.

YOUTH CLUBS: Responsible for implementing the International Junior Optimist and Octagon club building. Plans and conducts a Youth Club District Convention.

ILLINOIS DISTRICT POLICIES

(Adopted 2011 District Convention, amended 2015)

I. POLICY ADMINISTRATION

- a. **Implementation:** It is the duty of the Governor and the Executive Committee to insure the implementation of these policies.
- b. **Amendments:**
 - 1. A Policy Review Committee shall be appointed by the Governor. This committee shall be comprised of at least five persons, to include the Governor-Elect, the Parliamentarian, and at least one past Governor.
 - 2. Proposed changes to the District Policies should be presented to this committee not later than 45 day prior to the District Convention and shall be voted upon for the approval at the annual District Convention. If, however, proposed changes (or amendments to proposed changes) are introduced after the 45 day period, such changes shall require a 2/3 vote for approval.
- c. **Distribution:** Distribution of the Illinois District Policies shall be done annually as part of the Illinois District Directory.

II. DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION

- a. **Board of Directors**
 - 1. **Purpose:** The Board of Directors functions as the main legislative body for the Illinois District
 - 2. **Membership:** The Board of Directors is comprised of the following members:
 - 1. Governor
 - 2. Governor Elect
 - 3. Two Immediate Past Governors
 - 4. Lt. Governors
 - 5. District Secretary/Treasurer
 - 6. Assistant Governor (s)
 - 7. Club Presidents
 - 3. **Rights and Privileges:** Only these members may make motions, debate and discuss motions on the floor, and vote at the general assembly of the quarterly district meetings. The presiding officer may recognize other members when a motion is not on the floor if he/she so desires but is not required to do so. However, at the Annual Convention all accredited delegates are afforded the same privileges as the Board of Directors. The District Board shall annually determine the District Depository & signatories
 - 4. Meetings

- a. A Board of Directors meeting shall be held in each quarter of the Optimist year. It is recommended that these meetings be held not later than during the second month of each quarter, except that the first quarter meeting should be held in October. Zone Meetings or combined Region/Zone Meetings may replace the Second Quarter District Meeting as long as the Zones and/or Regions conduct training and business sessions during this quarter as authorized by the Governor.
- b. Arrangements for District Board Meeting facilities and meals shall be made by a committee appointed by the Governor. Program and all arrangements are to have the approval of the Governor.
- c. Spouses and children are encouraged to attend these meetings. It is the responsibility of the host committee to arrange for spouses' and children's entertainment.
- d. The District would encourage the presidents of all clubs to attend district meetings. However, should the president be unable to attend the Board of Directors meeting, an appointed delegate for that club would be allowed to speak and act as the president, in the conduct of the business coming before the Board of Directors, providing the delegate produces written proof of his/her appointment to the District Secretary-Treasurer.

b. Executive Committee

1. **Purpose.** The Executive Committee serves as the main advisory/ administrative body of the Illinois District.
2. **Membership.** The Executive Committee is comprised of the following members:
 - a. Governor
 - b. Governor-Elect
 - c. Two Immediate Past Governors
 - d. Lieutenant Governors
 - e. District Secretary-Treasurer
 - f. Assistant Governors
3. **Rights and Privileges.** The District is in support of open meetings for the Executive Committee. However, only members of the Executive Committee may make motions, debate and discuss motion on the floor, and vote. This does not prevent the Executive Committee from receiving verbal or written reports from individuals or committees at their request. The Executive Committee shall fill any vacancies in any office in the District.

4. Meetings. A minimum of four (4) Executive Committee meetings shall be held during the Optimist year. It is recommended that they be held immediately prior to the District Board meeting. If the Zone and/or Region option is chosen by the Governor for the Second Quarter, a teleconference with at least 51 percent of the Executive Committee on line may replace the Second Quarter Executive Committee meeting.

c. Appointed Positions

1. Assistant Governors. The Assistant(s) to the Governor may be appointed for one year by the Governor-Designate subject to the approval of the Executive Committee.

2. A District Secretary-Treasurer shall be appointed annually by the Governor-Designate subject to the approval of the Executive Committee. He/she shall have full voting rights on the Board of Directors and Executive Committee. The District Secretary-Treasurer shall not serve more than three consecutive years.

3. The Sergeant-at-Arms and Parliamentarian are appointed members of both the Executive Committee and the Board of Directors; however, they serve only in an advisory capacity. They may not make or vote on motions on the floor.

4. The Governor shall appoint all current committee chairs & may call for quarterly meetings

III. DISTRICT CONVENTION

A. Annual Convention. A Convention of the clubs of the District should be held annually during the month of August, but no later than September 30 and shall be a three (3) day convention beginning on Friday and ending on Sunday.

B. Convention Program. The convention shall embody the following features:

- 1.** A Lieutenant Governors-Elect conference.
- 2.** A quarterly Executive Committee meeting and a meeting of the Board of Directors.
- 3.** A "Club Administrative Conference" attended by newly-elected club and District officers. Club and District committee members are also encouraged to attend.
- 4.** The election of Governor-Elect for the coming year shall be held on Saturday.
- 5.** A Governor's Banquet and Installation of Officers shall be held on Saturday night with the International Representative as speaker.
- 6.** An "Old Timers Breakfast" which may be held on Sunday morning.
- 7.** The program shall have the approval of the Governor prior to printing.
- 8.** A Memorial Service, which may be held on Sunday morning, should be held for those members who have died during the prior year.

C. Convention Administration. The Convention is the District Convention. The Governor-Elect is chairperson of the Convention. It shall be planned and supervised by the Convention Committee, the Governor, and the Governor-Elect.

D. Proposed Convention Rules

1. The Convention shall be composed of delegates as set forth in the International Bylaws, Article VII; Section 4.
2. To be accredited by the Credentials Committee and eligible to vote on Convention business, delegates must have registered at the Convention, paid the registration fee, and produce such credentials as may be required by the Board of Directors.
3. Each club is entitled to one vote for each 10 members or major fraction thereof (6 or more).
4. On a voice vote or hand vote each club may use their allowed quota of votes but only with those accredited delegates present. Example – If your club is allowed 5 votes but only have 3 members present then you only get 3 votes.
5. On a written or paper vote the rule is different. Each club that has a registered delegate that is present shall be allowed their quota of votes without having their full quota of delegates present. Clubs may split their votes but must be a whole number. Each club shall select a chairperson to tally the results and report the same.
6. The Credentials Committee shall report at the first session thereof and periodically thereafter or when directed to do so.
7. The program as printed shall be the official program of the Convention.
8. Following the report of the Candidate Qualification Committee, the Governor-elect shall call for other nominations from the floor and then call for the closing of nominations.
9. Following the report of the Candidate Qualification Committee, there may be nominating speeches on behalf of all candidates.
10. A nominating speech, seconding speech, and candidate's response shall not exceed a total of twelve minutes for each candidate.
11. All voting shall be by voice, hand, or rising vote, at the discretion of the chairperson unless a ballot or roll call vote is ordered by a majority vote of the accredited delegates. In the event a vote by ballot is ordered, the chairperson shall appoint a committee of tellers and name its chairperson. If the balloting has been conducted for the purpose of electing an officer, the chairperson shall announce the name of the winner only and then entertain a motion to destroy the ballots.

12. No accredited delegate shall be entitled to the floor unless he rises, addresses the presiding officer, and gives his name and club affiliation.
13. Debate shall be limited to five minutes a speaker. No accredited delegate shall speak a second time to the same question at the sitting if another accredited delegate who has not spoken thereon rises and asks for the floor.
14. No accredited delegate shall speak more than twice on the same question if anyone objects.
15. Main motions shall be put in writing when the chairperson directs.
16. The chairperson shall entertain no motion unless seconded and shall not be open to debate or amendment before the chairperson has repeated it.
17. The vote on a question, once commenced, shall not be interrupted except to ask that the chairperson restate the question.
18. An accredited delegate may change his vote from one side to the other provided he rises and asks for the floor promptly and before the chairperson declares the result final.
19. Not more than two (one primary, one secondary) amendments to any question shall be pending at one time, but after disposal of one or both of them other amendments may be proposed.
20. The Convention may, to expedite the handling of business, limit as it chooses the time or the number of speakers for each side on any question, or the total time for debate, by a two-thirds vote.
21. The chairperson of committees may make partial reports during lull periods of the Convention unless otherwise ordered.
22. These convention rules shall be adopted by a majority vote, but they may be suspended, rescinded, or amended after their adoption by a two-thirds vote.
23. The rules as adopted for the current Convention shall be the proposed rules for the Convention in the following year.
24. In the absence of a specific convention rule or a specific printed Optimist International Bylaw, ROBERTS RULES OF ORDER shall govern the deliberation of this Convention.

E. Elections

1. Elections shall be held in accordance with Optimist International rules governing same.
2. In the event of nominations from the floor for Governor-Elect, there shall be a fifteen (15) minute recess in which time the Candidate Qualification Committee shall determine the candidate(s) eligibility.
3. To be eligible to be elected as Governor, a person must be a member in good standing and has served or is serving as a Club President. The Governor-Elect automatically become Governor 10/1 the year following election.

F. Registration. All district officers, club officers, and members are required to register on the official form supplied by the District and pay the registration fee for all District Board of Directors meetings and the Convention. All registered persons shall check in personally at the meeting and official attendance records will be made from these check-in forms.

IV. FINANCES

A. Finance Committee

1. The Finance Committee shall present to the first quarter District Board of Directors meeting a proposed budget for approval.
2. The Finance Committee may adjust items within the framework of the budget to suit the needs of the District, so long as the total budget is not altered or major categories appreciably changed.
3. The Finance Committee shall include in each annual budget a reserve in the amount of \$3500. This reserve shall be restricted to transfer and use by the incoming administration for expenses chargeable to the next fiscal year. Moneys will be available for transfer not later than the annual District Convention.
4. The Finance Committee shall review the adequacy of the Illinois District dues annually and report their findings and recommendation at the third quarter Board of Directors meeting.
5. The Finance Committee shall meet quarterly to review the status of current District finances and budgets.
6. An annual financial review of the prior fiscal year shall be given to the District Board by December 31.

B. Expenses

1. Budgeted monies for Governor, Governor Elect, Governor Designate, Assistant Governors, Lieutenant Governors, Committee Chairs, Parliamentarian, Sergeant At Arms and Secretary/Treasurers are to be paid up on submitting expense vouchers with the necessary receipts.

2. District Conference(s) and District Convention

- a. Eligibility:** Governor, Governor Elect, Governor Designate, Assistant Governors, Lieutenant Governors, Committee Chairs, Parliamentarian, Sergeant At Arms and Secretary/Treasurer.
 - b. Mileage:** Mileage will be reimbursed at the rate of 28 cents per mile.
 - c. Lodging:** Eligible attendees will be reimbursed for one night of lodging for Conferences and the Convention. A maximum of two nights lodging is allowed if the attendee is required to travel more than 100 miles each way.
 - d. Meals:** Only lunch and dinner served at the Conferences or Convention will be reimbursed.
 - e. Registration:** Registration fees for the Conferences and the Convention will be reimbursed.
 - f. Dual Office:** If a person holds more than one eligible office (i.e. Lt. Governor and Committee Chair) he/she may be reimbursed for only one position.
- 3.** Moneys allocated to the Governor, Secretary-Treasurer, Governor-Elect, and Secretary-Treasurer-Designate as expenses for the International Convention may be paid prior to the Convention date, upon approval of the Governor. Lieutenant Governors-Elect will be paid upon completion of Lieutenant Governor required training at the International Convention.
- 4.** Lieutenant Governors and District chairpersons will receive budgeted moneys at the discretion of the Governor, with the guidance of the Finance Committee and the District Secretary-Treasurer, upon submitting proper expense vouchers, substantiating the completion of the various requirements of their duties.

C. District Dues

- 1.** The District billing of dues to clubs by the District Secretary-Treasurer shall be made twice annually as follows:
 - a.** During the first quarter each club will be billed one-half of the yearly District dues, as authorized by the District Board of Directors and approved by the Optimist International Board of Directors. This billing will be based on the official membership count, as listed by Optimist International, as of September 30.
 - b.** The second billing to each club will be made in the third quarter, and the amount billed will be one-half of the yearly District dues, as authorized by the District Board of Directors and approved by the Optimist International Board of Directors. This billing will be based on the official member count as listed by Optimist International on March 31
- 2.** The membership list on September 30 and March 31 are to be used and not the current members listed when billing is received.

D. District Secretary-Treasurer

1. A copy of “Supplemental Guideline to District Policies” should be provided to all new officers each year by the District Secretary- Treasurer to be used as a guide for expenses.
2. The current District Secretary-Treasurer shall maintain minutes and District financial records for the current year and the past five years.

V. INTERNATIONAL PRESIDENT’S VISIT

- a. The International President will be invited to officially visit this District every other year. All clubs are encouraged to invite him/her to a special club meeting at any time.
- b. Arrangement for facilities and meals required for the International President’s visit to a club or the District shall be made by the host club of the visitation, under the direction of the Governor, and shall follow procedures as outlined in the booklet “How to Be a Good Host”, available through Optimist International.

VI. PUBLICATIONS

A. District Directory.

1. The Illinois District Directory, containing the names, addresses, and phone numbers of club, District, and international officers, District committee chairpersons, a list of Past Governors of the District, a list of any past international officer presently a member of an Illinois District Optimist club, District Policies, and the dates and locations of all District meetings and conferences of the administrative year, is a record that should be held in trust.
2. Its use for commercial or solicitation purposes shall be denied to all. The District may, however, sell advertising space in the District Directory providing the District has received prior permission from Optimist International.
3. The complete membership mailing shall be used exclusively for the promotion of Optimism in the State of Illinois and shall be denied to all for commercial solicitation, promoting a candidate for office other than an Optimist office, and club solicitation. Exceptions will be granted for charter parties, club anniversaries, etc., at the discretion of the Governor.
4. Distribution of the Illinois District Directory shall be made to all District Board members, District committee chairpersons, Past Governors, club secretary-treasurers, and others as approved by the Governor.

B. District Bulletin

1. The “Land of Lincoln” Bulletin shall be published electronically at least once each quarter.
2. The editor shall be the District Communications/Bulletin Chairperson.
3. Closing date for submission of articles shall be sixty (60) days prior to dates of each District Board meeting and the District Convention.
4. All clubs are encouraged to submit articles and pictures for each publication to the editor prior to the closing dates.
5. Electronic copies of the bulletin will be made available to the general membership through the district website.
6. Lt. Governors, club presidents and District committee chairs shall receive an electronic copy of the bulletin provided their email address is on file.
7. The Lt. Governors should assist the clubs within their zones in setting up electronic communications.

VII. ORGANIZATION

A. Clubs.

1. It is encouraged that all clubs impress upon candidates for club offices that their attendance at all District Board meetings, Zone meetings, and the District Convention is of prime importance.
2. It is the duty and responsibility of the club president, as a member of the District Board of Directors, as well as the secretary-treasurer, to be in attendance at all District Board meetings and the Convention. It is strongly emphasized and recommended that provisions be made in the club budget for defraying the cost of attending said meetings.
3. It is recommended that clubs institute an indoctrinating program for incoming officers in order to acquaint them with their duties and to insure a smooth transition to the new administration.
4. It is emphasized that new members be assimilated as soon as possible after induction so they feel they are an active part of the club.
5. Each club shall be incorporated as a non-profit organization.
6. Attendance at Charter Presentation, International President’s Visitation, and other meeting of a District nature by club members is encouraged.
7. Clubs are requested to actively participate in international programs such as Youth Appreciation Week, Essay and Oratorical Contest, Optimist International Junior Golf Championships, as well as Community Service, Respect for Law, etc.
8. Host clubs for District officers’ visitations should follow the procedures outlined in “How to Be a Good Host”, furnished by Optimist International.

9. All Optimists handling club funds must be bonded.
10. Clubs are urged to refrain from lending their good name to any fund raising campaign, project, or activity unless its members are actively participating in or conducting such a program.
11. Individuals and clubs shall not offer merchandise for sale, conduct raffles, or engage in any fund raising activity at any Zone or District meeting, nor at the International Convention.

B. Zones

1. Pursuant to the International Bylaws, the number and boundaries of Zones for any administrative year, if subject to revision, shall be determined by the Board of Directors prior to its meeting held in the third quarter of the preceding year to accommodate selection of Lieutenant Governor to serve during the next administrative year.
2. All proposals for realignment of Zone boundaries shall be submitted to the Governor not less than 30 days prior to said meeting. No Zone should be created with fewer than four (4) clubs.
3. New clubs shall automatically be assigned to the Zones of their sponsoring clubs. On October 2, new clubs will be assigned to the Zones in which they are geographically located and services thereto shall be the responsibility of the Lieutenant Governor of such Zone.
4. Lieutenant Governors are to be elected during the third quarter District meeting from a slate of candidates presented by the Governor-Elect or from open nominations from the floor. If there is no candidate from a given Zone, the office shall be declared vacant. An appointment may be made at a later time pending the approval of the Executive Committee.
5. Lieutenant Governors shall not be eligible to succeed themselves through election. In the case of emergency, they may be appointed to fill a vacancy with the approval of the Executive Committee. In any case they should not serve more than two terms in succession.

VIII. CONTESTS

A. Club Project Awards. Entries must be completed and submitted to the Activities Committee Chairperson by September 30. The entries will be judged at the first quarter District Board meeting and winners entered for competition at the next Optimist International Convention.

B. Communication Contest for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing (CCDHH)

1. The Communication Contest for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing (CCDHH) in the Illinois District will be conducted in accordance with the official rules of the contest as published by Optimist International.
 - a) Contest awards at the club, zone, and district levels will be awarded as detailed in the official rules.

2. The district contest will be held at the third quarter conference. The district contest will be conducted under the direction of the District Chair, who is appointed by the Governor. The District Chair will also be responsible for coordinating club and zone contest deadlines and guidelines.
3. A single entry fee must be paid to cover the cost for each contestant participating at the zone contest (if applicable) and district contest. The amount of the entry fee will be established by the District Chair and approved by the Governor. The contestant's sponsoring club will pay the entry fee.
4. The sponsoring club is responsible for the following costs for their contestant:
 - a) Entry fee as detailed above
 - b) Transportation for the contestant to all contests beyond the club contest
 - c) Lodging for the contestant, if required, for all contests beyond the club contest
5. The District is responsible for the following costs:
 - a) Lunch for each district contestant at the District Conference
 - b) Half of the lunch cost for up to three guests for each district contestant
 - c) Plaques for winners at the zone and district levels

C. Essay Contest

1. The Essay Contest in the Illinois District will be conducted in accordance with the official rules of the contest as published by Optimist International.
 - a) Contest awards at the club, zone, and district levels will be awarded as detailed in the official rules.
2. Club Essay Contests will be conducted during the first quarter of the Optimist year under the direction of each club's chairperson.
3. The district judging of the Essay contest will be conducted under the direction of the District Chair, who is appointed by the Governor.
4. An entry fee must be paid to cover the cost for each contestant participating in the district Essay Contest. The amount of the entry fee will be established by the District Chair and approved by the Governor. The contestant's sponsoring club will pay the entry fee.
5. The winner of the district Essay Contest will be invited to attend the third quarter District Conference to read the winning essay.
6. The sponsoring club is responsible for the following costs for their contestant:
 - b) Entry fee as detailed above
 - c) Transportation for the contestant to the District Conference
 - d) Lodging for the contestant, if required, for the District Conference

7. The District is responsible for the following costs:
 - e) Lunch for the district winner at the District Conference
 - f) Half of the lunch cost for up to three guests for the district winner
 - g) Plaque for the winner

D. Optimist International Junior Golf Championships (OIJGC)

1. The District Optimist International Junior Golf Championship shall be held in the month of June in enough time to allow for necessary arrangements to send one (1) boy and one (1) girl winner to the Optimist International Junior Golf Championship Tournament in July. The District tournament is to be under the direct supervision of the District Optimist International Junior Golf Championship chairperson and conducted according to the rules and/or guidelines of Optimist International Junior Golf Championship and the PGA. The District Board of Directors will approve one entry fee, per contestant, that will be paid for each entrant. The District will pay the cost of conducting the District tournament and the expense of sending one (1) boy and one (1) girl winner to the International Championship Tournament. All other expenses to and from the District tournament shall be borne by the individual participant or the sponsoring clubs.
2. An annual entry fee schedule shall be determined by the District Executive Committee upon the commendation of the District Optimist International Junior Golf Championship Chairperson.

E. Oratorical Contest

1. The Oratorical Contest in the Illinois District will be conducted in accordance with the official rules of the contest as published by Optimist International.
2. The District Oratorical Contest will be held at the third quarter conference. The district contest will be conducted under the direction of the District Chair, who is appointed by the Governor. The District Chair will also be responsible for coordinating club, zone, and regional contest deadlines and guidelines.
3. A single entry fee must be paid to cover the cost for each contestant advancing to a contest beyond the club contest (zone, regional, or district). The amount of the entry fee will be established by the District Executive Committee, based on the recommendation of the District Oratorical Chair. The contestant's sponsoring club will pay the entry fee.
4. The sponsoring club is responsible for the following costs for their contestant:
 - a) Entry fee as detailed above
 - b) Transportation for the contestant to all contests beyond the club contest
 - c) Lodging for the contestant, if required, for all contests within the district beyond the club contest.

5. The District is responsible for the following costs:
 - a) Lunch for each district contestant at the District Conference
 - b) Half of the lunch cost for up to three guests for each district contestant
 - c) Prizes for winners as defined in the official rules of the contest as published by Optimist International.
 - d) Lodging and transportation costs for the District winner to Optimist International Oratorical Championship
6. Zone Contests. Zone Oratorical Contests are to be conducted by the assigned Lt. Governor or zone chairperson, under the supervision of the District Oratorical Chair.
7. Regional Contests. The region's Assistant Governor or a chairperson appointed by the Governor, under the supervision of the District Oratorical Chair, shall conduct the Regional Oratorical Contest. Regional Oratorical Contests shall be held with a nearly equal number of zones in each region and simultaneously or as nearly so as practical. Regional participation certificates will be presented to all participants. The District Oratorical Chair shall determine the number of regional contests to be held, following the rules as published by Optimist International.
 - a) If a two region system is selected, the top two contestants from each region will advance to the District Oratorical Contest, without determining a regional winner.
 - b) If a three region system is selected, the top contestant from each region will advance to the District Oratorical Contest.
8. District Contests, the contest winners will be awarded scholarships by the Optimist International Foundation in accordance with the Optimist International rules. The scholarships awarded to District winners will be \$2500 for first place, \$1500 for second place and \$1000 for third place.

F. Poster Contest

1. The District Poster Contest will be held at the third quarter district conference. The district contest will be conducted under the direction of the District Chair, who is appointed by the Governor.
2. The poster contest will be open to fourth, fifth, and sixth grade students. There shall be boys and girls divisions.
3. Each club may submit one boy winner and one girl winner to the district finals.
4. Monetary awards, to be determined by the Governor, shall be given to first, second and third winner for each division.
5. Posters shall be horizontal 22"x 14" in size.

6. The posters shall include only original artwork. No computer-generated or printed pictures or wording are allowed.
7. The back of the poster should contain the following information: grade, gender, teacher's name, student's full name, address, and phone number.
8. An entry fee, to be determined by the Governor and District Chair, must accompany each entry.

Supplies

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Illinois District History and Past Governors

The first Optimist club is recorded to have been formed in Buffalo, New York in 1916. At that same general time clubs were also forming in Indianapolis Indiana; as well as Syracuse and Rochester, New York among other places.

In May of 1917 the first conference of these Optimist clubs was held at the national headquarters in Indianapolis. Thirteen (13) clubs attended that conference, and among those thirteen were the Optimist clubs of Chicago, Peoria, and Springfield, Illinois.

In 1919 the first convention was held in Louisville, Kentucky, and on June 19th the association of clubs that is known today as Optimist International was formed. In 1922, the convention held that year approved the first official emblem of Optimist International and also adopted the "Optimist Creed" as our organization's official creed.

We can trace the roots of the Illinois District to the beginning in 1917. From 1919 through 1964, clubs in Illinois were part of many separate sections and districts (districts 8, 12, 17, and 23). A lot of information has been lost in history, though the International staff has been able to provide some information. Many past governors are not listed below simply because the information has been lost. In 1964 our clubs became members of two new and distinct districts as Optimist International began to use names for districts rather than just numbers. Our clubs became part of either the Northern Illinois District, or the Central Southern Illinois District.

In 1970 the two separate districts were combined to unite all of the clubs in the state into one Optimist District—the Illinois District. This district retained the identification number of (12). Our rich history can be traced by the members who have served as Governor of our district or its predecessors. Three of our past Governors are counted among those who have served as President of Optimist International; James W. Chilton, Harlington Wood, and Gene Sternberg.

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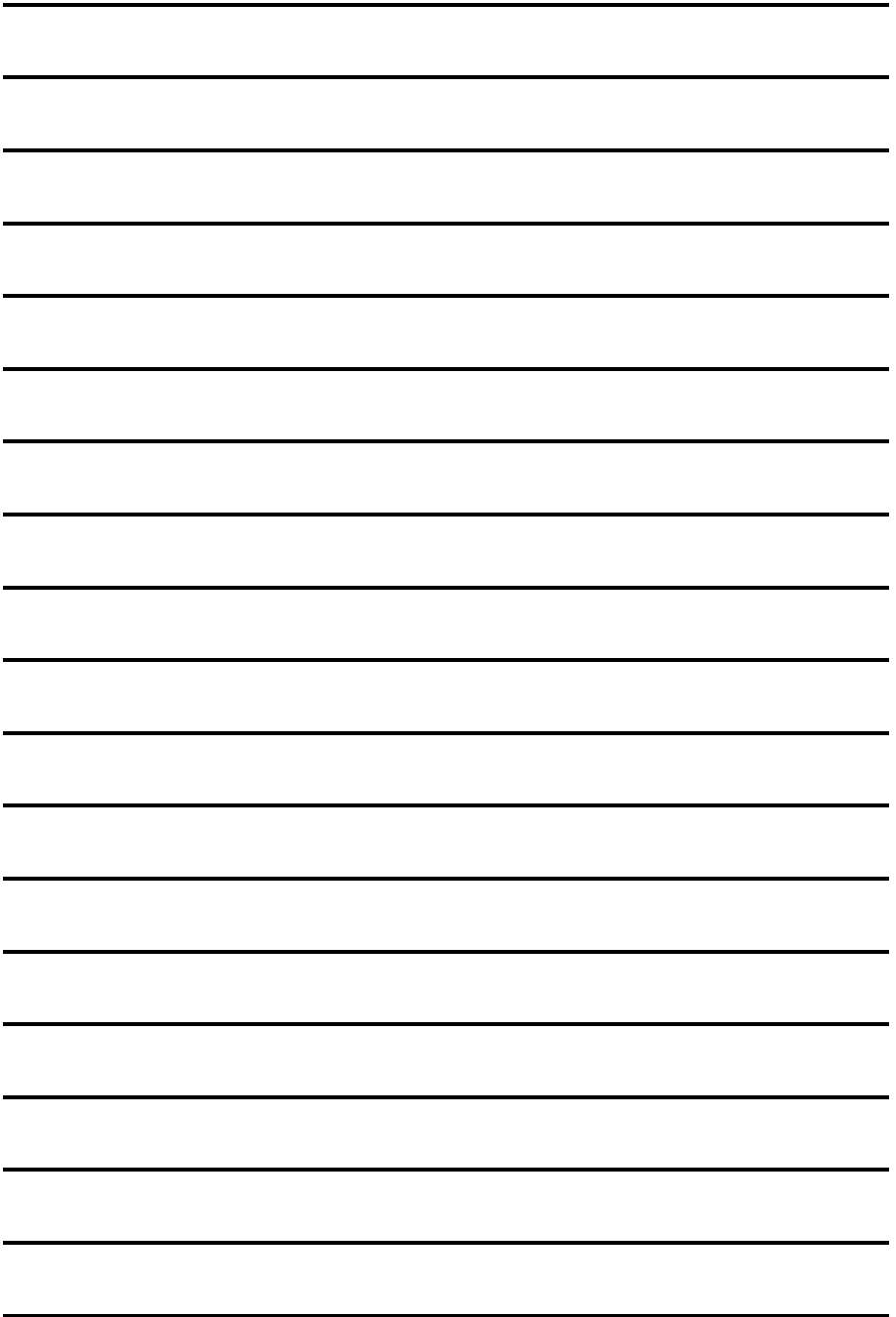
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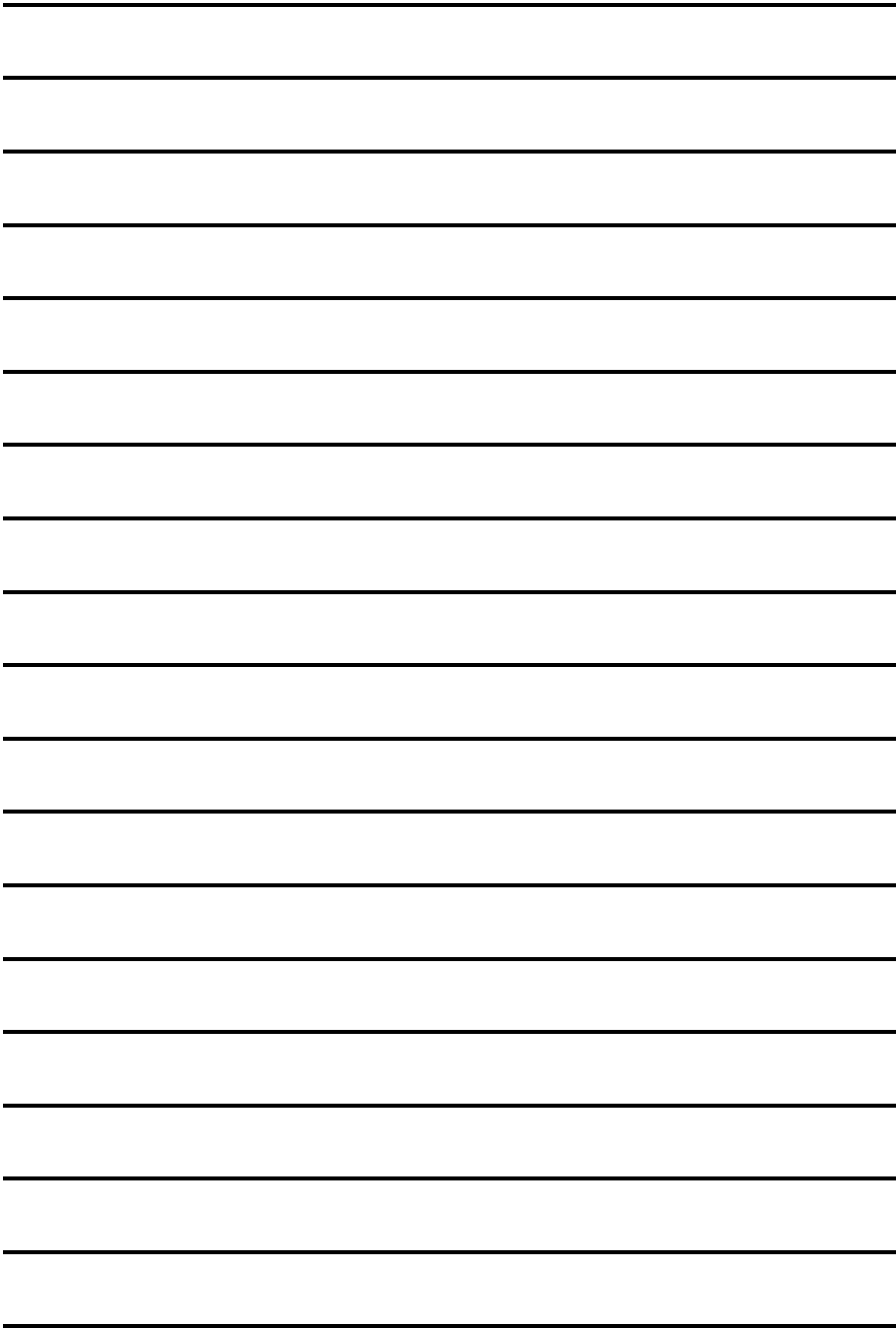
