From Chairman of District Leadership Committee, John Good, 21-22 President of The Glenview Club, *Subject: Leadership*

OI Leaders are often identified by a number of traits they all possess. Unfortunately, they often forget one of their roles as leaders is searching for and recruiting new members into their clubs.

The age-old question has always been, "WHERE CAN I FIND NEW TALENT?" Have you considered, this "new talent" may be someone you already know? It may be a friend of a member in your group, or a person you interact with socially or finally, an acquaintance of yours you simply forgot might be a candidate? This person is simply unaware until you ask them.

I have found the final, yet most critical piece of the puzzle of recruiting new members isn't a phone call or an email. Those are only steps towards what seems to work best, a face-to-face meeting, at their convenience. During this meeting, a key phrase I have often used is "I NEED YOU " as opposed to " We need you".

Make sure you are prepared with a solid reply when "WHY?" or "I'm too busy" comes up. People who are already in other clubs/activities and say they are too busy, have the unique talent of being able to multitask. This person has critical talent and is exactly the type of person you want in your club. Typically multitaskers get things done.

A number of people I have recruited using this method, have told me they joined our club due to this specific personal touch. Let me know how it works for you.

From Bill Wagner, Past Governor, and Illinois Golf Outing Chair Illinois District Golf Qualifiers make Cut at Optimist International Tournament in Doral

On June 15-17 2020, 60 junior golfers competed to earn the right to represent the Illinois District at Doral Golf Club outside of Miami Florida. These golfers competed in 7 age categories ranging from 10 years to 18 years of age. The field this year consisted of 34 girls competing in three age divisions and 26 boys competing in four age divisions. This year's qualifiers were Sophia Gold, Quincy, in the girls aged 13-14 division. Ty Novosel, also from Quincy, qualified in the boys 12-13 age division.

Another Quincy participant was Gabriel Gold who qualified in the boys 14-15 age group. Brady Kaufman from Jacksonville won a competitive boys 16-18 age division to qualify for the Optimist International field in Miami.

Brady represented the district quite well as he finished eighth out of a field of 134 golfers at the OI tournament outside of Miami. All District qualifiers made the cut in their respective divisions at the Optimist International competition. Illinois also had 3 boys compete at large in the OI tournament. They were Peyton Woods from Springfield, Ryan Kruse from Waterloo, both competed in the 16-18 age group and Jaden Smith from Waterloo competed in the boys 14-15 age division. While these boys did not make the cut, they gained valuable experience for next year's event..
